<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Veteran has been using a blood glucose monitor (BGM) and is frequently testing (>4 times or more/day).	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Inability to meet desired glycemic control despite adherence to the prescribed treatment regimen.

Therapeutic CGM is provided based on the Veteran's individual medical needs and is prescribed based upon clinician and patient shared decision making as recommended by the VA/DoD Guidelines of Management of Diabetes Mellitus in Primary Care (2017)<sup>2</sup>
